Tomar Más

No importa a qué hora del día visitemos a mi suegra, ella siempre tiene comida que ofrecer. Si tomamos dos porciones, ella nos animará a tomar tres. Si tomamos tres porciones, ella dirá: “Coraggio, toma más.” (Ella es italiana, en caso de que no te dieras cuenta por la comida y el idioma).

Cuando Jesús alimenta a los cinco mil con el milagro de los panes y los peces, no produce solo la suficiente comida para alimentar a todos los que están allí. Ciertamente podría hacerlo; eso estaría en su poder. Y muestra preocupación por el desperdicio, por lo que tendría sentido que lo hiciera. Pero en lugar de eso, deliberadamente sobre produce. Crea más comida de la necesaria. Él hace una gran cantidad de ella. ¿Por qué?

Creo que es por la misma razón que mi suegra nos sigue instando a comer cuando vamos a su casa. Alimentar a las personas no es sólo una acción funcional. Es un gesto. Muestra amor. Muestra preocupación. Muestra bienvenida. Tener comida en abundancia (tanta que sobra algo) es una señal de que no te importa cuánto quiera alguien: estás dispuesto a dar lo que esté dispuesto a recibir. Estás listo para dar imprudentemente. Estás listo para darles no sólo todo lo que necesitan sino también todo lo que puedan desear.

Pienso en esto cuando me acerco al sacramento de la Confesión. Una y otra vez camino hacia la puerta de esa pequeña habitación, con una lista de pecados frecuentemente repetidos en la mano y un sentimiento de vergüenza en mi corazón.

Aquí estoy de nuevo, Jesús. De vuelta por más misericordia. Espero que no se te haya acabado.

Todavía no lo ha hecho. Él nunca lo hará. “Coraggio,” susurra en lo profundo de mi corazón, “toma más.”

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GOSPEL MEDITATION

The world is filled with people whose basic needs aren't met, whether for clean water, nutrition, safety, education, meaningful work, stable family life, basic medical resources, religious freedom, and the right to life. So how can we possibly believe what Psalm 145 says to us this week, “**The hand of the Lord feeds us, he answers all our needs**”? Does he? What about the countless poor? Can't we identify at least a few unmet needs in our own lives right now? Is the Bible promoting wishful thinking and laziness in helping others?

No. The psalm flows from Israel's experience of God's relentless fidelity again and again —especially in the Passover from Egypt. This divine providence is recalled when Jesus feeds the needy multitudes in the Gospel of John. Passover arrives once again, and the people are hungry like the ancient Israelites on the wilderness journey. What is new is that in Jesus God not only provides for their needs, but He learns what it's like to have those human needs. He shares them too. He feeds them bread and fish; and even more, He hungers to provide them, and us, much more than just that kind of perishable food.

Our deepest need is for God. Like the multiplied bread, all earthly provisions ultimately fail, for we all finally die. Of course, our obligation to meet the needs of the poor is basic. But Christ promises to feed us with the one bread that never fails: God Himself. He is humanity's eternal food. If we eat this bread, we taste the faithfulness of God who answers all our needs, even when every earthly thing fails.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Take More

It doesn't matter what time of day we visit my mother-in-law — she always has food to offer. If we take two helpings, she will encourage us to take three. If we take three helpings, she will say, “*Coraggio — take more.*” (She's Italian, in case you couldn't tell from the food-pushing and the language.)

When Jesus feeds the five thousand with the miracle of the loaves and fish, he does not produce *just* enough food to feed everyone who is there. He certainly could — that would be within his power. And he shows concern about waste, so it would make sense for him to do that. But instead, he deliberately overproduces. He creates more food than is necessary. He makes an abundance of it. Why?

I think it's for the same reason my mother-in-law keeps urging us to eat when we come to her house. Feeding people is not just a functional action. It's a gesture. It shows love. It shows concern. It shows welcome. Having an abundance of food — so much that there is some left over — is a sign that you don't care how much someone wants — you are ready to give whatever they are ready to take. You are ready to give recklessly. You are ready to give them not just all they need but also all they could want.

I think of this when I approach the sacrament of Confession. Time and time again I walk up to the door of that little room, a list of oft-repeated sins in my hand and a sense of shame on my heart.

Here I am again, Jesus. Back for more mercy. Hope you haven't run out.

He hasn't yet. He never will. “Coraggio,” he whispers deep in my heart, “take more.”

SIGNS AND INSTRUMENTS OF GOD'S GENEROSITY

Who are we in the eyes of God? What can God do with us? After all, we are no more than little people in a vast world. Today's liturgy shows us that God can do very much through us and with the little we have to give. When we give to God our time, our life, our talents and the little we can do, God turns them into blessings for many. God can do great things with us, but we have to put them at His disposal. The gospel shows us what Jesus could do to satisfy the needs of a large crowd with the meager gifts of a little boy. We ask the Lord to make us generous with the little we have.

Humankind has been and is periodically tormented by want and famine. Today, the undernourished and the starving have become a huge multitude of some three billion people! The root of this tragedy is not scarcity of resources, but lack of wisdom and generosity. It is not so much a problem of production, as a problem of distribution and solidarity. **More than a problem of "multiplication," it is a problem of "division" – a problem of lack of sharing.** Too many affluent nations give the crumbs, rather than the full loaves.

What the world needs today is to remember that the fruits of God's blessings are for all. We Christians have a special responsibility in reminding mankind about this truth, and especially in putting it into practice. We are to consider ourselves the descendants of the selfless boy who put his provision at the disposal of Jesus. We are challenged to imitate him. If we do imitate him, then miracles will happen everywhere, every day.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK:

Are you sensitive to the hunger of today's poor? Do you believe that you are being called to share the modest portion of "five barley loaves and two fish"? Are you personally involved in making the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves happen in your community/society today?






